OUT & ABOUT ADVENTURES

Whilst out walking, my mind wandered. I was idly thinking about dinner which was to follow. The phrase *"Moveable Feast"* then sprung to mind, which made me start to think about our special O&A language, that has developed over the years.

So what is an Out & About "Moveable Feast?" It is auite simple, everyone chooses their lunch, which is recorded on a schedule, before the order is submitted. Often when the food is served, the waiter/waitress shouts out the name of the meal. rather than the name of the person who ordered it. Eager faces light up and everyone's hands shoot up in the air, regardless of what they ordered! Chaos ensues. When unable to intervene in time, our volunteers give up their choice and tuck into something they would have preferred not to eat. Whilst at a pub in Sherbourne St John, the phrase "Moveable Feast" was first adopted. Macaroni Cheese made its way to me. I hate the stuff. I assured my team I could eat this muck. My fork got so far, then my throat constricted. Meals were generously shuffled around the table again. We applaud anyone who delivers meals to a named person, using our schedule.

Our minibus has two names: "The Limo" and "The Fun Bus". Out & Abouters call it "The Limo". Carers of those attending the



Maidenhead Service, call it "The Fun Bus" as they await its return! I was asked by Buckingham Palace for a description of it. My reply was" three toned: white with patches of rust and green algae." However, it is important to note that we are very fond of him, having had a wakeup call, when he broke down. The alternative minibus was aptly named "Bumpsy Daisy." It was impossible to stand up in it. We were so delighted when we were reunited with "The Limo." Sometimes you only appreciate something when you lose it.

Onto the **"Naughty Seat"** ... that is MY seat, minding the door and working alongside Glenn, our driver. There is also the **"Rear Naughty Seat"** – for anyone who has shown the desire to tap our driver on the shoulder and request "the next stop".

What is the "*Magic Number*" that the O&A volunteer team share amongst themselves? It is the number of people we go out with, in the hope that we return with the same number and hopefully the same people we took out!

Dennis, a long serving O&A volunteer was awarded the title of *"The Robin Hoofer"* many years ago, in appreciation of his valuable jogging skills. So how did this come about? Robin was one of our very first Windsor Out & Abouters.

He was physically fit and liked our activities but was averse to sitting down for lunch.

We often had to jam Robin into the most inaccessible seat at lunchtime, but nothing stopped him; he simply crawled over us. On one occasion Robin never made it through the door of The Toby in Old Windsor. He "hoofed" it home, with Dennis in hot pursuit. Having ensured Robin had arrived home safely, Dennis did the return jog in the rain, arriving just as we had polished off our desserts. When "**The Robin Hoofer**" is in action, and anyone asks where this title came from, we remember Robin and the indelible mark he left upon Out & About.



At Waltham Place Farm "Little Al" was presented to us, shrink wrapped. He was the runt of a litter of piglets and died of a heart attack. As he hadn't been to the slaughterhouse there were only two options; bury him or eat him. O&A made sausages from him. The smell of the animal intestine,

used to form the natural skin of a sausage, is absolutely revolting. If your sausage curls when it is cooked, it has a natural skin. If it remains straight, you are eating a synthetic product. Qur quality sausages spewed out of a machine in uneven sizes, but who cares ... we had so much fun and from then on, we shout "Sausages" when posing for a photo.

Glenn continues to nurture **The Limo/Fun Bus**, by turning the battery over each week, no doubt singing Mo Town music to soothe feelings of neglect. I guess The Limo/Fun Bus has a tad more algae and rust on him, a bit like all of us in lockdown.
