# Student designs assistive tech for people with Dementia

A university student has developed a new device to support people in the early to midstages of Dementia so they can be more independent.

Elliot Heffernan, 22, created Activity Aid to help people like his grandmother who experience difficulties in remembering how

to carry out day-to-day tasks. The device allows Carers and family members to record vocal instructions on how to make a cup of tea, for instance, enabling people living with Dementia to be more self-sufficient.







# **OUT & ABOUT ADVENTURES**

"Variety is the Spice of Life" and that "varied spice" is what we aim to deliver at Out & About, in a safe manner. It is an opportunity to do things you have enjoyed in the past, or even better, widen your horizons and experience something new. Often O&A challenges predisposed notions that

dementia precludes participation in certain

activities.

Indeed, Nysa, our Director of Operations, admits to being perturbed, when she learnt we were off to do archery! I had a bit of explaining to do. I delivered a detailed risk assessment, similar in length to a roll of toilet paper (in the days before Covid19 - when none of us appreciated the value of such a commodity).

Our archery sessions are led by professional staff at SportsAble, an aptly named charity who aim to make sports accessible to people with disabilities. We are given a safety briefing, before the activity begins. Whistles are blown to warn us when we must stop shooting, or stay clear of an area, whilst arrows are collected. A larger team of O&A volunteers always support this activity. We sit behind a row of tables, separating us from the shooting area and applaud when the bullseye is hit. It is magical to see the elation on faces. Alternatively, we commiserate together when arrows take refuge in the curtains behind the target.

Up until this year it has been an August tradition for each O&A service to visit Brooklands Motor Museum, when their experienced volunteers offer rides in their prize vintage cars during school holidays. On our first visit, these were offered for free on our arrival. I envisaged a tame drive through leafy Surrey and found myself on a "steep" learning curve; pardon the pun. Working with Brookland's volunteers, we

identified which cars were suitable for each person, mindful of access, whilst ensuring one of our volunteers was in each car. Safely seated, off we went. A flag waved us on our way. We sped up the hill. At the top, I offered up my thanks for my safe delivery, ready for my reward of a sedate picturesque ride.

It was not to be.

The vehicle entered the original Brooklands track which is a concrete bank I slid towards the side of the vehicle, whilst my feet desperately searched for terra firma. I don't do fair rides! A vision of green Out & Abouters, suffering future nightmares,

flashed through my mind. What had I agreed to? Glad that my ordeal was over, I reluctantly looked at my charges and my team of volunteers. I was met with a sea of faces exuding exhilaration!

Maddie, a member of Brooklands' staff, has come to know our group well over the years, and greets us as long-lost friends, with hugs all round. She so enjoys ribbing me over my "love" of their car rides, when giving her introductory presentation. Unable to visit this year, or sadly hug our friends, I have been let off the hook!




